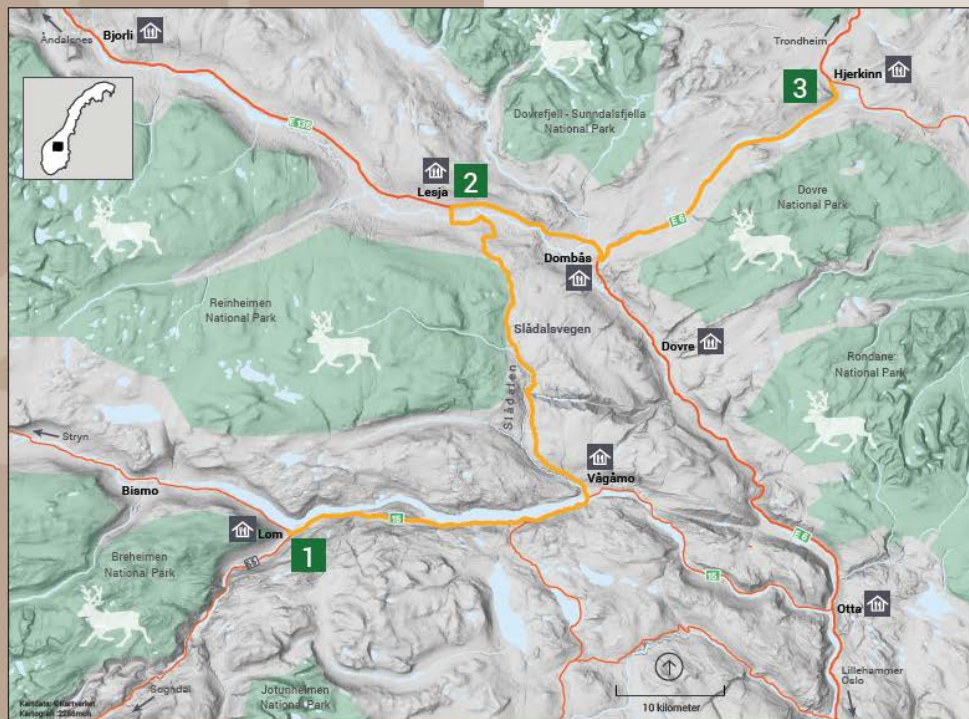

Accommodation and dining locations
The wild reindeer herds roam freely in national parks



Follow the 110 kilometre-long Norwegian Reindeer Trail. You choose whether you want to spend one or more days on the trail, and it can be combined with other local attractions in the stunning landscape.

The Norwegian Reindeer Trail is located in the north of Gudbrandsdalen, where you will also find many accommodation and dining options in a unique setting.

From Oslo to Otta takes about 4 hours by bus. From Otta to Trondheim takes about 3.5 hours by bus. From Lom to Ålesund takes about 3.5 hours by bus.

1 The Norwegian Mountain Center

The Norwegian Mountain Center is a visitor centre for the Jotunheimen, Reinheimen and Breheimen National Parks. Along with the centre, you will also find the Norwegian Mountain Museum. The Center also operates Klimapark2469. The Norwegian Mountain Center provides information, tips and advice on mountain areas and hiking in the mountains and national parks. The captivating 'Bergetatt' main exhibition on mountains will allow you to experience the highlights of mountain history all in one place: mountain pioneers and discoveries in snowdrifts, the mountain viking's sword, outdoor life, hunting and trapping, myths and mountain adventures - and a huge mammoth.

2 Lesja bygdemuseum

Visit the idyllic historical museum in the heart of Reinheimen National Park. The exhibition 'The Reindeer hunters arrive' takes you on a journey through reindeer hunting from the earliest hunter gather societies up to present day. Meet the people behind the archaeological finds; hear stories on how they utilized the reindeer for survival and growth. Learn more about how reindeer hunting today is a central part of the modern society and life in Lesja. You can also participate in a guided tour of Lesja church with its uniquely carved interior.

3 Norwegian Wild Reindeer Centre

At the Norwegian Wild Reindeer Centre at Hjerkinn, you will find both the Wild Reindeer Visitor Centre and the world-renowned design icon viewpoint SNOHETTA. At the Wild Reindeer Visitor Centre, you will gain an insight into the trapping techniques that we can still find traces in our mountain areas.

At viewpoint SNOHETTA you can experience Dovrefjell from a truly unique vantage point. On the path up to the viewing point, information is provided on the shared 10,000 year history of man and wild reindeer in Norway. The combination of exquisite architecture and outstanding views make this a unique experience.
